Scripture Reflection

During Lent the Church "goes on retreat." Many find it a good time for self-reflection and spiritual exercises that lead to a change of heart. One traditional path to transformation is through acts of penitence with prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Scripture emphasizes the mercy of God, the grace of God that changes hearts. Acts of penitence do not persuade God to be merciful; God's mercy leads us to be penitent.

The fasting of Lent made practical sense in the past, when food supplies were limited. In the springtime especially, when winter stores were depleted but new crops had not matured, fasting was necessary. Springtime hunger was part of the natural order of life, and many concluded that it was God's will. Modern farming practices ensure that people in the developed world have an uninterrupted supply of food. We might have good intentions--trying to give up vices like smoking or excessive online entertainment--but the deeper meaning of Lenten fasting, to follow the will of God. is sometimes lost.

In Scripture, the desert is a place of testing and isolation: there Jesus encounters the devil. Like all temptation, this one appeals to Jesus' self-identity. The devil begins with the phrase, "If you are..." He's inviting Jesus to flaunt his identity and his mission, perhaps even challenging its genuineness. Matthew places this event right after Jesus' baptism, when he was called "beloved" by the heavenly voice and from there began his ministry. Lent becomes for us a time to remember who we are: baptized in the Lord for the work of the Lord.

Lent asks, "Have we put our trust in what only appears to be good, pleasing, and desirable, or in the One who alone can satisfy our hungry hearts?" Open your eyes to see who we are, children of God who belong to Jesus Christ. May our Lenten journey renew our identity so that we can discover what it really good, desirable, and life giving.

Forms are available at the church doors. Everyone is invited to participate in the Prayer Partner activity this Lent. You will receive by mail the name of a parishioner along with the name of someone preparing to receive Baptism, Confirmation or Eucharist during the Easter Season.

LENT HAS BEGUN

The forty days of Lent prepare us for the Three Days. Our ashes this past Wednesday reminded us that like Jesus who died on the cross, we too will die. The blessed ashes also called us to repentance. We must turn away from sin. Through Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving, we prepare to commemorate the Three Days - Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter. The spiritual quality of our Lent will reflect the spiritual quality of our Easter. The serious, penitential days of Lent have arrived. The Cathedral is simply decorated - no flowers, no plants. The Cross is placed next to the baptismal font; the purple hangings are displayed, and only two candles stand on each side of the altar. There are no Alleluias and no Glory to God. As we pray the I Confess at the beginning of Mass, the Church asks that we strike our chest once with our hand at the words "through my most grievous fault". Sinfulness and the need for God's mercy are before us. Intensify prayer, fasting, and giving alms to the poor. Baskets are placed at the church doors for your donations of non-perishable food items or cleaning and paper products throughout the Lent and Easter seasons. Plan to go to Confession during these Lenten days. The parish Communal Penance Service is scheduled for Wednesday, April 5 at 6:30 PM.

The CROSS - Our beautiful eight foot CROSS has been placed at the baptismal font for the seasons of Lent and Easter. This is the cross that will be used on Good Friday for veneration. This custom-made cross holds the relic of the True Cross. Special respect is to be shown to this sacred object. As you enter and leave the Cathedral by way of the front doors, take time to show reverence to this Cross. A genuflection would be proper; one may kiss the sacred relic; one may touch the relic of the True Cross. Please make the conscious effort to show some form of respect to this very holy symbol of the faith. During the forty days, take more time and thought when signing yourself with the sign of the cross.
