Scripture Reflection

Today's Gospel reading immediately follows the Beatitudes. The first eight address an unidentified "they." In verse 11 Jesus now speaks to his disciples: "Blessed are you." The metaphors of salt and light in the Gospel reading remind the disciples that they are a visible witness to the gospel that Jesus proclaims. As disciples, they can no more deny their responsibilities than salt can exist without taste. The purpose of salt is to add flavor, the purpose of light is to shine. Jesus reminds the disciples that their purpose is to allow others to see their good deeds and glorify their heavenly Father in response.

Salt and light characterize the essence of discipleship. First, salt is both essential for life itself and valuable for preserving, seasoning, and purifying food. Its value is in its effect on something else. Applied to disciples, they too are valuable to the extent that they influence others. Second, the disciples are a light that shines forth in the darkness of ignorance or faithlessness, like a city on a mountain or a lamp on a stand in a house. They enlighten others not by words but by their manner of living, a manner of living that declared to the world that the reign of God has indeed been established in their midst.

Salt was important in Jesus' time for preserving meat and for bringing out the taste of food. Its usefulness depends on its interacting with something else. When it doesn't interact, it is useless. So, too, if a follower does not live in the world as a child of the kingdom, the world will be bland. True disciples give our world its flavor. The disciples must show themselves to the world as followers of Jesus, rooted like him in the law and the prophets. With so much darkness due to oppression, false accusations and malicious speech, the disciple who shares bread with the hungry, helps shelter the homeless, clothes the naked, and does not live indifferent to the needs of others, will truly be salt and light.

 How am I salt? Which of the traditional uses of salt---as a flavoring, a preservative, an offering---best describes how I see my role as a follower of Jesus?

How do I let my light shine? Which of the scriptural descriptions---as a city on a mountain top or as a light on a lampstand---better describes how I see my role as a disciple of Christ?

Directives With Regard to the Flu Season

The Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown has received an advisory from public health officials that the reported cases of "the flu" and similar contagious viruses remains a serious concern at this time. Therefore, Bishop Bartchak has asked that the Precious Blood of the Lord not be offered at Mass temporarily. It is the belief of the Catholic Church that the whole Body of Christ is present under either form of consecrated bread and wine. Also, the exchange of the sign of peace should avoid bodily contact. A reverent nod with eye contact and a smile will be the temporary practice. Reception of Holy Communion on the hand is encouraged; however, reception on the tongue may not be denied. These norms are in effect through the winter months or until the flu season is over.
