On Holy Saturday, April 8, Bishop Mark will lead us in the Office of Readings at 9:00 A.M. Easter Food Baskets will be blessed at Our Lady of Fatima Church at Noon. This year, the Easter Vigil begins at 8:30 P.M. with the blessing of fire on the portico. The Bishop is the celebrant.

Easter Sunday Masses, April 9, are at 8:00 A.M. and 10:00 A.M. (There is no 5:00 P.M. Mass.) Mass at Our Lady of Fatima Church is at 11:30 P.M.

April 6th. Resuming the practice of offering the chalice will be introduced gradually since we don't know how many people will be ready or willing to receive. Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds

sign when it takes place under both kinds. However, it is important to remember that the complete presence of Christ's body,

blood, soul, and divinity is received in each of the Eucharistic signs of bread and wine. The choice of the communicant is to be honored.



You are encouraged to pray sung evening prayer before the Blessed Sacrament this Sunday at 6:30 P.M. Vespers will be concluded with Benediction.



Stations of the Cross will be prayed this Friday at 5:30 P.M.



Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Abstinence refers to not eating meat at all on those days. Persons 14 years of age and older are to abstain. Fasting refers to one full meal, with two small meals, no eating between meals. People who have reached their 18th birthday and up to their 59th are obligated to fast. In addition to these obligations, additional forms of fast and abstinence may be observed.

What's your car? Let's say it's a fancy silver Toyota. Now imagine vou're having lunch in a restaurant and suddenly see two men outside attempting to steal it. You run outside and confront them. They respond, "The master has need of it." How do you respond? Would you just let them take it, and leave you without a car? I don't think I would.

Yet that is precisely what the owners of the colt on Palm Sunday do. Stunningly, and perhaps a little comically, Jesus instructs two of his disciples to commandeer a colt for him to ride. And when they hear the disciples say, "The master has need of it." they let them take it. Of course. Jesus knew they'd let it go. He gave them the grace to let go of what is rightfully theirs. The result? That colt became perhaps the most famous and important animal ever. The beast plays a role in the redemption of the world.

As Holy Week begins. Jesus perhaps will send people to you to ask for something valuable to you. Perhaps it's your car. More likely it's something like your attention, time, or energy. It's natural to resist at first. We've got things to do, after all. But if the interruption is from Jesus himself, listen to that voice which calmly says, "The master has need of it."
