Stewardship Reflection

Today's Gospel readings brings us to the very essence of a stewardship way of life, as Jesus responds to a question posed to Him by one of the scribes: "Which is the is first of all commandments?" His answer is a beautiful and concise description of a Christian steward's life: "The first commandment is this, You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Let's consider these 'greatest commandments' as they relate to the three aspects of a Christian stewards daily life, the use of our time, our talents and our treasure. The use of time refers primarily to our relationship with the Lord, or in other words, our prayer life. The use of talents refers to the way I offer abilities, skills and interests the Lord has given me for the good of those around me. And the use of material gifts demonstrates both a love of God and neighbor. When I trustingly offer a sacrificial gift to God through the offertory collection, I am showing Him in a very tangible way that He comes before all else in my life. At the same time, my gift is showing my love for my neighbor as others are helped through my financial offering.


SEVENTH GRADE RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CHRISTIAN SERVICE
