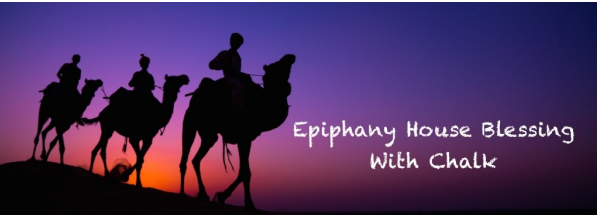

Stewardship Reflections

As our celebration of Christmas continues, this week we observe the great feast of "The Epiphany of the Lord". The word "epiphany" comes from Greek and means manifestation of appearance. The stewardship way of life is one of which we live in grateful response to God's countless manifestations in our lives.

As Christian stewards, we are all called to manifest God's love to each other in the sharing of the gifts. St. Paul describes this beautifully in our second reading in his letter to the Ephesians, saying, "You have heard of a stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit." We have all been given unique and wonderful gifts from our good and generous God. He wants us to share these gifts to benefit others and so to give Him glory.

Let us rejoice in God's manifestations in our lives and be watchful for the new ways He is calling us to share ourselves and gifts in gratitude to our King in the year ahead.



The Epiphany household blessing is an ancient practice in the Church. This tradition is a beautiful way to observe the coming of the magi while invoking God's blessing on our home and all who enter it. All that is needed is chalk and a prayerful heart. [A piece of chalk and a blessing are available in packets at our entrances this weekend.]

The ritual is simple: a member of the family calls down God's blessing and an inscription is made about the door with chalk.

The inscription this year is: 20+C+M+B+26. The initials C, M, and B represent the traditional names of magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, and also signifies the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*: "May Christ bless this house." © LPI
